Covid-19 Vaccination Update

This week, our first patients received the new Oxford-AstraZeneca vaccine administered in their own GP surgeries in the Merthyr Tydfil and Bridgend areas. Witnessed by the media, 82 year old Ralph Evans was the first in Wales to be jabbed with the new vaccine. Read about it on our website [here](#).

This means we have now carried out **10,200*** vaccinations since the start of the programme in December last year.

In this last week alone, we have vaccinated **1320*** people.

In our area, approximately **100,000** people are in the top four priority groups (full list of groups below), and it is our aim to have them vaccinated, with at least their first dose by mid-February 2021.

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The people most at risk of COVID-19 will be prioritised first. If you are eligible for the vaccine, please wait to be contacted.

The priority list for having the Coronavirus vaccine is:

- 1 residents and staff in a care home for older adults**
- 2** all those 80 years of age and over, and frontline health and social care workers
- 3 all those 75 years of age and over**
- 4** all those 70 years of age and over and clinically extremely vulnerable individuals
- 5 all those 65 years of age and over**
- 6** all individuals aged 16 years to 64 years with underlying health conditions which put them at higher risk
- 7 all those 60 years of age and over**
- 8** all those 55 years of age and over
- 9 all those 50 years of age and over**
