HOW TO BE A BETTER ALLY

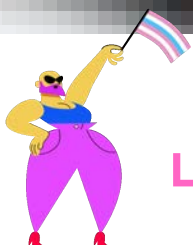

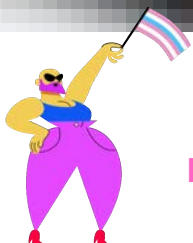


FRIDAY 10-11AM

We will be welcoming Rudy Harries from Trans Aid Cymru to talk about their own experiences of accessing healthcare as a trans person

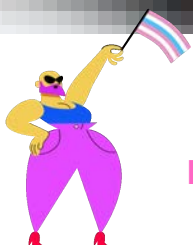
